C.W.L. MEETING (Contid from P.3) beautiful capabilities and their opportunities are endless. In his observations he concluded that actually teenagers are no more of a problem than any other age group. Proper training, which begins in the home and continues on through Church, School, Recreation departments and other contacts, must be given to these young people to prepare them for adult life. "We should be concerned, not because he is a member of a group, but because he is an individual who desires our assistance and understanding so that he can develop as a mature, moral, responsible person prepared to take an active and important part in

society, "Mr. Ward continued. Even equipped with a set of standards life is confusing and frightening; the power of example is great. He is taught that drinking and abuse of sex are wrong, while the medium of television exploits these enemies and further frustrates him.

Mr. Ward felt that, after reading an excellent booklet "Code for Teenagers" this concrete plan should be followed:-

- 1. Parents must exercise their God-given authority over their children by applying God's laws to their lives and conduct.
- 2. Children must be taught what is right in their relationship to God, their families, their country and their fellowman.
- 3. Parents must show their love for their children by being interested in everything they do.
- 4. Parents must set a good example for their children.
- 5. Each child must be treated as an individual.
- 6. The child must be helped to understand that he must do what is right.

In this area Mr. Ward stressed that steady dating at twelve and thirteen is wrong: use of intoxicants by teenagers is wrong: modesty in dress is a must and, of course, parents should know where and with whom their children are at all times.

A question and answer period followed and Mrs.H.Boudreau thanked Mr.Ward on behalf of all those present.
