INAUGURAL MEETING OF COUNCIL

The inaugural meeting of Council was held January 15th with Reeve W.E.D'Arcy, Councillors F.V. Harness, P.J. Guina, J.M. McGrath and Mrs. Inez McCuaig, also Clerk-Treasurer R.C. Skinner and E. Borutski, road supt., present. Mr. D'Arcy welcomed Council and spoke on expected projects for year--the proposed new subway of first consideration. He was optimistic regarding possibility of the financial difficulties of the water department being resolved by the erly blanket of snow. All expenditures this year must be viewed with budget-wise eyes, the reeve stated. The tax burden on ratepayers should not be unduly increased since so many live on fixed incomes. Councillors echoed the reeve's remarks, each bringing issues concerned with particular committees. All were concerned over the small citizen representation at the nomination meeting. Mr. Harness suggested regular meetings which begin at 7 P.M. be closed not later than 10 P.M. This was agreed upon and the night set for the 2nd Tuesday of each month.
