RECREATION MEMBERSHIP DISCS READY - PICK THEM UP AT THE RECREATION OFFICE NOW 111

Under the new Recreation Association Membership control system, each member of every family belonging to the Recreation Association will receive a numbered disc signifying that they belong to the Association.

There are two types of discs:
BLACK DISCS - held by members of families belonging to the Recreation Association ONLY. These discs entitle holders to all privileges of the Recreation Association EXCEPT FREE USE OF THE SWIMMING POOL.

RED DISCS - held by members of families belonging to BOTH the Recreation Association AND the Swimming Pool Association. These discs entitle holders to all privileges of the Recreation Association INCLUDING FREE USE OF THE SWIMMING POOL.

As noted, the discs are numbered, so that each person has a particular number on our membership files which corresponds with the number on the disc. For this reason, it is imperative that people use ONLY the disc assigned to them.

Size of the plastic disc is such that adults can easily carry them in the windows of change purses. Also, there is a small hole in each disc so that children may wear them on a chain or pin them to clothing.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THESE DISCS MUST
BE SHOWN AT ALL FUNCTIONS FOR WHICH AN
ADMISSION CHARGE IS MADE (e.g., hockey
games, shows, public skating, roller skating
etc.) Those failing to show these discs
will be charged as non-members. THIS IS
NECESSARY TO MAKE THE SYSTEM FUNCTION
SUCCESSFULLY.

Also, discs must be shown when applying for memberships in various activity groups, as proof that the individual belongs to the Association.

THIS SYSTEM WILL GO INTO EFFECT AS OF FEBRUARY 9TH.

WE ASK ADULT OR OLDER MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY TO PICK UP THEIR DISCS NOW AT THE RECREATION OFFICE.

DO NOT SEND YOUNGER CHILDREN. ---

Sheets containing full information on the system will be given to each family, along with the discs.

THE RECREATION OFFICE WILL BE HANDING OUT DISCS UP TO 6 P.M. EVERY NIGHT THIS WEEK AND FROM 9 - 12 ON SATURDAY MORNING. GET YOURS NOW ::
