Arguing the adviseability of the situation Council felt the present two garages would remain as such under the Town's statutes and no guarantee could be given.

Council rejected a recommendation by the Library Board to be moved into the old Curling Club Lounge, suggesting instead an extension of present hours to accommodate their patrons. Councillor Valiquette felt advise could be given on rearrangement of the present Library. Reeve Heenan stated the old Lounge could be better utilized as office space.

Reporting on a meeting with the Fire Department Councillor Adamo questioned the ability of the Fire and Police Departments to integrate. Reeve Heenan called a special meeting of Council for Monday, January 28th at 7:00 P.M. to discuss the Departments and arrange salaries.

Councillor Fraser reported a complaint on a defective meter.

C.E. PAGET REPORTS ON ONTARIO T.B. ASSOC. MEETING

On January 18th and 19th, Mr. C.E. Paget, representing the Thunder Bay East Tuberculosis Association in his capacity of Vice President and Ontario Tuberculosis Association representative, attended the semi-annual meeting of the Ontario Tuberculosis Association held at the Westbury Hotel in Toronto.

The meeting was well attended by enthusiastic volunteer members of the Association. Excellent speakers provided a broad coverage of the various aspects of detection, treatment and extent of the disease as well as the role of the voluntary organizations.

Some points of major concern to local associations and the general public are as follows: - (1) Some people have the idea that tuberculosis is no longer a threat in Canada. This is completely wrong. At our present rate of progress it will not be until the year 2010 that T.B. will be effectively controlled; even then it will not be eradicated in Canada. If we relax our efforts at all, we will lose ground already gained. (2) Much more research is required- a reliable vaccine is urgently needed. Improved drugs for treatment are required. There is a probability that strains of the disease resistant to present drugs are being produced. (3) The world T. B. problem is serious. For example there are 5,000,000 active cases in India alone, with one death per minute from the disease. Foreign countries provide a vast reservoir for the disease which will always be a threat to our country until they are under control. (4) North-western Ontario and Northeastern Ontario (excluding Indians) have much the highest incidence of active T.B. of the ten regions for Ontario. If the Indian cases are included our district has twice the incidence as the average for Ontario. (5) The role of local T.B. association is to: (A) Conduct Christmas Seal Sales to raise funds to support research, provide mobile X ray unit, assist the T.B. hospitals in treatment of patients. (B) Assist in conducting case finding surveys of the public. (C) Keep the public informed of progress in the treatment of the disease and the extent of the danger of infection still present. (D) Concentrate efforts on high incidence groups to encourage or insist that they have frequent medical examinations.
