

STATIC BENT-LEG SIT-UP

This is an excellent exercise for strengthening the all-important abdominal muscles which support and protect the vital internal organs and help you maintain correct abdominal posture. Strong abdominal muscles also help give you a slimmer, neater appearance and protect you from possible strain or rupture.

Lie on your back on the floor, knees well bent, feet flat on the floor near your hips, hands clasped behind your head. Have someone hold your feet down or place them under a chair, dresser or similar heavy object. From this position raise your upper body until you are half-way to a full sitting positive positive to a full sitting positive to the state of the tion. Hold this position for a count of 5 then continue forward all the way until your chest touches your knees. Immediately lower steadily to the half-way spot for another count of 5 then continue down to the floor and repeat for 6 reptitions.

Add another every 3 - 4 days until you

can perform at least 12.

If you find this too difficult at first, do the exercise with your legs straight, moving to the bent-leg version once you have gained the necessary strength.
