CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the Schreiber-Terrace Bay Children's Aid Society was held in Terrace Bay Recreation Centre, Tuesday evening chaired by Mr. W. Furlonger. After welcoming the members and representatives he called upon the Secretary-Treasurer, Mrs. N. McGuire, for the minutes of the last annual meeting.

Reports for the year were given by Mrs. McGuire and Miss Muriel Atcheson, Children's Aid Society representative for the district. Both ladies respectfully attributed the foun ding of the local committee to the late Mrs. E, Graham.

Assistance from many sources were noted with gratitude by the Society: - a donation of \$450.00 from the Kimberly-Clark Employees Charity Fund, \$418.13 from the North Shore Nurses, \$300.00 from the St. Lawrence Corporation Employees Charity Fund. Generous donations of clothing and toys were acknowledged from the Schreiber and Terrace Bay C. W.L., the Terrace Bay C.G.I.T., the Community Church Ladies Auxiliary, Terrace Bay Public School and to the Lakehead Freightways whose free delivery of donations to needy homes or communities received a special mention, as well as innumerable individuals.

Miss Atcheson described the past year as an active and successful one. She stated that Children's Aid was synonymous with children and the aim and purpose of the Society was always upon them however there had been a sharp increase in demand for family services. A great deal of work in this area, Miss Atcheson informed the group, was with the Indians. At the request of the Department of Indian Affairs, the Port Arthur Children's Aid Society has instituted a program at Mobert Reserve. Various employers of the area met with the Indians explaining the types of employment for which they could qualify. Mr. Earle, Director of the Marathon Recrea tion had advised in organizing a community recreation program and the old school was converted to a community hall.
