PROGRAM

The present safety objective of the Kimberly-Clark Pulp and Paper Company is to establish 200 safe days of operation. This objective can be reached if all employees work safely until May 22nd, 1963. When this objective is reached nine \$50.00 Family Vacation Safety Bonuses will be awarded. Winners will be selected by draw.

All employees with ten or more years of accident-free service will have three name cards placed in the draw container. Employees with five or more years of accident-free service will have two name cards placed in the draw container. All other employees will have only one name card placed in the safety draw container.

The Family Vacation Bonuses will be presented to the winners when leaving on their vacation as scheduled.

If a disabling injury is experienced prior to May 22nd, 1963, this program will be cancelled.

KC-ECF ANNUAL MEETING

At the annual meeting of the Kimberly-Clark Employees' Charity Fund held recently, B. Hayes was elected to the Board of Directors to replace P. Romaniuk who resigned. On behalf of the Board and the members of Kc-ECF, Chairman W. Baillie expressed appreciation for the service rendered by Mr. Romaniuk, explaining that he had been instrumental in organizing the Fund and had served as a Director for three years.

In his annual report the Chairman advised that \$6,006.50 had been donated to charity in 1962. He stated that there were 456 Kimberly-Clark employees representing about 83 percent of the payroll contributing to the Fund and that several new members had been signed up in the current canvass of non-members. He suggested that because of the rising costs facing charitable organizations, members should consider increasing the amount of their donations to the Fund. This, he said, could be done by contacting any one of the Directors.

Mr. Baillie advised that copies of the financial statement, as published last Fall, are available to anyone at the Mill Employment Office.
