stir into dry ingredients. The batter will be thin. Pour the mixture about 1/4 cup or a little less onto a hot buttered griddle or skillet. Cook until browned on both sides. Spread with jam, roll up and sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Keep warm while cooking the rest of the pancakes.

Yield about 16 pancakes.

Customarily, Shrove Tuesday Pancakes are served with lemon juice and sugar, so omit the jam if you prefer. All milk may be used in place of beer.

COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve J.P. Heenan presided at the regular session of Council Thursday afternoon in the Municipal Office. Councillors Valiquette, Fraser, Wellings and Adamo were present and assisted by the Secretary W.F. Strutt and W. Hanley.

Minutes of the previous meeting were accepted and Council dealt with correspondence.

Ontario Fire Marshall Martin Hurst wrote to Council commending the Terrace Bay Fire Department on their latest award. The National Fire Prevention Association had judged the Terrace Bay Fire Department first in Ontario and first in Canada in Class "F" population up to 2500. Councillor Fraser will convey the congratulations of Council to Fire Chief R. Hofland and his Department. Fire Chief Hofland's report for the month of January was short, due to the fact that he had relieved the hospitalized Police Chief since January 14th. He also commented on the Nat. Award. They had been in competition with 566 other Departments across Canada and this Award would be added to the eleven already won since 1950. The Award would be in the form of a certificate and plaque.

The Catholic Women's League were granted permission to hold a St. Patrick's Tag Day.

Judge W.J. Creighton requested suitable accommodations be provided to hold Juvenile and Family Court in Terrace Bay. Council agreed to make arrangements. Correspondence informed Council on the newly-established cost of Pest Control and the areas to be sprayed.

Replying to a letter from C.K.P.R. Reeve Heenan voiced approval of their endeavours to supply this area with good broadcasting and wished them every success with their venture. Rejecting an offer from Texaco to accept only that portion of their waterline on Municipal property, Reeve Heenan explained as suppliers of water they required all the line in order to maintain it. The agreement had been to turn over the entire waterline to the Township upon completion of all legalities.

payment for the sub-station, the power conversion being completed.

Reeve Heenan requested that Councillor Wellings bring in a Road estimate for the year, and the matter of road expenditure was discussed. Councillor Wellings reported to Council on the Recreation meeting he had attended.

Through Councillor Wellings a request for a Garage license was forwarded by the Texaco Service Station. Council agreed the matter was specific with Town By-Law stating only two Garage licenses be issued. The complaint that one Garage was holding a license without operating would be investigated by Reeve Heenan.

The Township now had full title to the swimming pool land, and arrangements for a grant could be continued. Discussing the unfinished work on the change house, Council moved to have the necessary plumbing completed locally by F. Hanna, thereby qualifying for the winter works program.

Reeve Heenan reported on an Emergency Measures Organization meeting he attended with J. Thomas and W. Farrell and work roughed out to handle town emergencies, (not necessarily that of war).

The appointment of Mr. Ken MacLeod to the Recreation Committee replacing L. Waghorn was approved by Council.

Councillor Adamo was vehement in his complaint of dogs running at large and insistent that drastic measures be taken to curb the nuisance. Councillor Valliquette stated the Police Dept. were swamped with complaints and suggested a raise in dog license \$ 10 and \$ 20 might eliminate a good deal of the trouble.

Councillor Fraser and Valiquette deferred their reports until Council met Friday evening for a special meeting. Also attending Council was Mr. A. Zieglerman.
