CAMERA CLUB DISCUSS FORMING ARTS & CRAFTS GUIL

A meeting of the Terrace Bay Camera Club was held in the old curling lounge on March 3rd. A report on the meeting held with the Art & Ceramic Clubs executives for the formation of an Arts & Crafts Guild was given by the President, D.Large and the Sec.Treasurer, A.Chadney. Considerable discussion revolved around this item and it was felt by all members present that forming of such a Guild would be an asset to all clubs which might be associated with it.

The Constitution and By-Laws of the Club were adopted and the dues set at \$5.00 per year with an additional \$2.00 initiation fee being payable on membership application. Membership is open to all members of the Recreation Assoc. who subscribe to the constitution and by-laws of the club. Meetings are to be held on the first and third Sundays of each month in the old curling lounge and it is hoped that club activities may be carried out year round, including the summer holidays.
