

**COUNCIL QUOTES (Cont'd from Page 1)**

stated heavy equipment such as the grader could not be used on driveways. He had also received many complaints, his own driveway being the highest in town.

Correspondence informed Council J. Phillips had been elected Chairman of the Recreation Committee for 1963 and M. Campbell, Vice Chairman. Council notified K. MacLeod of his appointment as a member of the Recreation Committee. Councillor Adamo was vociferous in questioning methods whereby persons were appointed to the Recreation Committee. He intended to recommend the maximum term of office be for two years not three, with no re-appointment to the Board. Councillor Valiquette noted the volunteer had come to him, following proposed appointment of Mr. MacLeod by the Committee, remarking also Councillor Adamo was defeating his own purpose for the name he submitted had already served a period of five years and now he wished him back. Councillor Adamo still felt appointments should be more open with the public given an opportunity to serve. The Reeve agreed and recommended notice be served in the papers prior to appointments, thereby seeking volunteers.

Recreation accounts for February were thoroughly perused and discussed. Councillor Adamo repeated his request for a copy of receipts and the Secretary would oblige. Councillor Valiquette noted the Figure Skating Club was the only one to pay their own way. The Reeve conceded it was, other than for ice time, which they all got free. Recreation accounts were then duly passed.

A motion was passed to make application for road expenditures grant in 1962 of \$10, 429.22. The Reeve requested the Secretary present a comparative statement every month after the budget was set, also show bank reconciliation statements. Councillor Wellings itemized his proposed budget for Public Works and Roads amounting to \$35, 900. Councillor Wellings had been interviewed by a representative from the Water Resources Commission and they had agreed on the feasibility of installing a pumping station to the new lagoon. The Secretary had made formal application.

The Reeve announced Councillor Wellings and the Electrical Supervisor, Mr. D. Boudreau, would represent them at the Municipal Hydro Convention in Toronto this week.

Although Councillor Adamo represented Council at the last meeting of the Chamber of Commerce he sought Mr. N. Cornthwaite's assistance in reporting. Mr. Cornthwaite was present only as a spectator but, on the invitation of the Reeve, enlightened Council to the effect that the Chamber had given up control of tourist rooms this year. The Reeve failed to see why Council should become involved despite Councillor Adamo's arguments on inspections, licensing, etc.

Councillor Valiquette had been notified to attend a meeting that night in Schreiber with regard to the Transient Fund and would report to the Reeve.

It was reported sidewalks in the shopping plaza were not being cleared, and business men felt this to be the responsibility of the town. Council agreed it was to the merchant's advantage to have his own sidewalk cleared and therefore his responsibility. Councillor Fraser recommended this be specified in the paper with merchants responsible for their walks as well as townspeople responsible for

their own driveways. Driving hazards by both Churches during Services was again discussed, and Councillor Wellings offered to meet with Councillor Valiquette and Constable Billings to review the situation. The Reeve agreed but felt they had a much bigger problem downtown daily which required their attention.

Enquiring on the new contract established for the Snack Bar, Councillor Fraser was informed it was now on a straight rental basis. He recommended the Department of Transport be invited down to view television in town, and the Reeve stated this had already been done. The Councillor continued by reporting the College at Gravenhurst had been able to enroll Fire Chief Hofland for their summer course, but unable to take the other two names submitted. The Reeve requested Councillor Fraser and Adamo inspect the resuscitator before the order went in.

Ratepayers W. Kurylo and J. Santerre were present, also N. Cornthwaite.
