BOARD OF BROADCAST GOVERNORS

OTTAWA CANADA

FOR AUTHORITY TO INCREASE THE POWER OF LPRT, STATION CBLB, SCHREIBER, Ontario

The Board of Broadcaster governors will hear, at a public hearing opening in Ottawa, March 26th, 1963, an application by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation for authority to increase the power of low power relay transmitter CBLB, Schreiber, Ont., to 40 watts, on the assigned frequency of 1340 Kc/s.

Persons wishing to oppose the application must file ten (10) copies of a brief in opposition or a notice of intention to oppose setting out the grounds of the opposition with the Secretary of the Board at 48 Rideau Street, Ottawa, on or before March 15th, 1963.

Persons wishing to inspect briefs submitted with respect to the above application may do so at the offices of the Board at Ottawa by appointment with the Secretary of the Board.

The East Thunder Bay Tuberculosis Association met in Mrs. W.G. Furlonger's home on March 6th. Mrs. L.O'Neill was welcomed as a new member and the resignations of Mrs. K. Baxter, Marathon, Mrs. R.G. Skinner, Schreiber and Mr. & Mrs. E. Stobart, formerly of Terrace Bay were accepted with regret.

The Annual meeting will be held May 12th when outside representatives will be invited to attend.

Mrs. W. Sheehan presented the financial statement and a donation was made to the T.B. Research fund. The Seal Sale Chairman, Mrs. B. Lidkea reported \$5,042. was realized from seal sales throughout the district.

Mrs. Furlonger, Case Finding Chairman presented her report including numbers of X-rays and costs from April 1/62 to February /63, from referred clinics, plus other costs.

The pupils of all Schreiber Schools and Rosspoint School were tuberculin tested--434 citizens were X-rayed at the Mobile Unit in October. There are twenty-nine patients from this district in the Sanatorium.

Mrs. W.C. Lidkea, in her Welfare report, said Christmas gifts were sent to all San patients in our district, also eyeglasses, pyjamas and clothing. Mrs. Bruce Lidkea, Mass

Survey Chairman reported 5,508 X-rays were taken throughout the district in the Mass Survey, May 1 to Nov. 2nd., and said every community except McDiarmid, Manitowadge and Cameron Falls has a regular skin testing program for the schools. The Education report, read by Mrs. McCuaig, stated that a film had been shown at a meeting and pamphlets were distributed. Mrs. McCuaig and Mrs. B. INCREASED BORROWING AT PUBLIC LIBRARY
