## COUNCIL APPROVES PLEBISCITE

Reeve J.E. D'Arcy and full council attended the April meeting of municipal council when the following plebiscite was approved:

Are you in favor of Government Stores for the sale of liquor? Are you in favor of the establishment of Government Stores for the sale of beer only for residence consumption? Are you in favor of the authorization of Ontario Wine Stores for sale of Ontario wine only for residence consumption? Are you in favor of the sale of beer and wine only under a dining room license for consumption with meals on licensed premises? Are you in favor of the sale of liquor under lounge license for consumption on licensed premises? And that application be made to the Liquor License Board of Ontario to fix a date for taking a vote on the aforesaid questions?

It was agreed the cost of rental, and use of the cesspool pump must be revised to be commensurate with the cost of operation.

Council McGrath reported delivery of the welder-thawing machine and was authorized to devise a conveyance for it. He also reported fan for the hall basement had been installed.

The required by-law was passed making E. Borutski, road Supt. inspector to enforce the trench excavators Protection Act.

A leak which has developed in the Fire Hall roof was left to inquiry by Mr. Guina and Mr. McGrath, also the removal or protection of hospital equipment for community use stored there which is indanger of being damaged by the water.

A letter regarding drainage at Walker Lake was referred to Dr. J.M. Cornell, M.O.I.
