

**MEN'S CHORUS PRESENT SPARKLING CONCERT**

The Best Yet, must have been the theme for the Tenth Annual Spring Concert presented Friday evening by the Terrace Bay Men's Chorus, and their efforts were received with resounding applause as they appeared together with their guest performers, in the Highschool Auditorium.

Backdrops by the Terrace Art Club were a tremendous addition and inspiration as the Chorus appeared in selections under four headings: Sacred Music, Songs for Men, The Gay Nineties and Songs of the Sea.

Master of Ceremonies Mr. A. Chisholm bade the music lovers welcome and introduced the various numbers. Appearing first in choir gowns, the men, led by their Director Mr. Bert Lohr and accompanied by Mrs. Ellen Hodgkiss, stood behind choir stalls and with a huge stained glass window behind them sang "Creation", "Laudamus", "Onward Christian Soldiers" and "Let There Be Music".

One of the town's young proteges, Master Ronald Matuszak, was the first guest artist and seated at the piano played, "Chopin's Waltz", "A Flat Waltz" and "Hungarian Dance No 6" to be encored on again for a lively Polka.

'Songs for Men' found the chorus in casual attire amid a beautiful desert scene to sing "Border Ballad", "Marching On", "Great Day", "Swing Along" and "Yellow Rose of Texas".

Returning to the stage after intermission the scene was set inside a barber shop with Mr. Lohr directing the barbers. The Chorus was very bright with their Gay Nineties costumes of red and white striped jackets, bow

ties or multi-colored shirts and braces, bowler hats and mustaches to present "Peg O' My Heart", "I Want A Girl", "Aura Lee", "Heart of My Heart" and "The Wiffenpoof Song".

Moinie's Happy Five proved to be none than local musicians Don Whitley, Bill Farrell, Bill Colborne, Don Brearley and Bert Lohr to play five snappy German tunes.

The last selections of the Men's Chorus was set on a wharf scene with a big sailing vessel tied up to it, another large sailing vessel coming over the horizon. Commercial net and pilings surrounded the stage when the entire Chorus appeared in nautical attire including the accompanist in oilskins to sing "Navy Hymn" with solo by Ernie Kettle, "Song of the Jolly Roger", "Away to Rio", "Eight Bells" and "Shenandoah". To judge by the response of their audience, the many new and light selections included in this concert were tremendously successful.

**SPRING "HYDRO SPECIAL" FEATURES REFRIGERATORS**

A province-wide promotion of electric refrigerators and freezers is being supported jointly by manufacturers, appliance dealers, and district electrical utilities during the Spring "Hydro Special" campaign May 18th to June 29th.

Purpose of the campaign is to focus attention on modern improvements in food storage units.

Although present saturation of electric refrigerators in Ontario is 98 per cent, the average refrigerator is nine years old, and has a capacity of only seven cubic feet. And only 16 per cent of Ontario families enjoy the advantages of a separate home freezer.

A free electric hair dryer will be offered to each purchaser of a qualifying electric refrigerator or freezer during the promotion. Participating appliance dealers will display this hair dryer, together with qualifying refrigerators and freezers, during the six-week campaign period. The hair dryer has a luggage-type carrying case, with vanity mirror, pin tray, and nail-drying equipment.

For a family of four which shops once a week, refrigerator capacity for fresh food should be a minimum of 11 cubic feet, and minimum freezer capacity should be four cubic feet.

Qualifying refrigerators are new, two-temperature models, with a frozen food compartment or section capable of zero, or below zero, temperatures. Both single and double door models are eligible.

All freezers, both chest and upright models, which are made by participating manufacturers or suppliers, are eligible for the bonus hair dryer.
