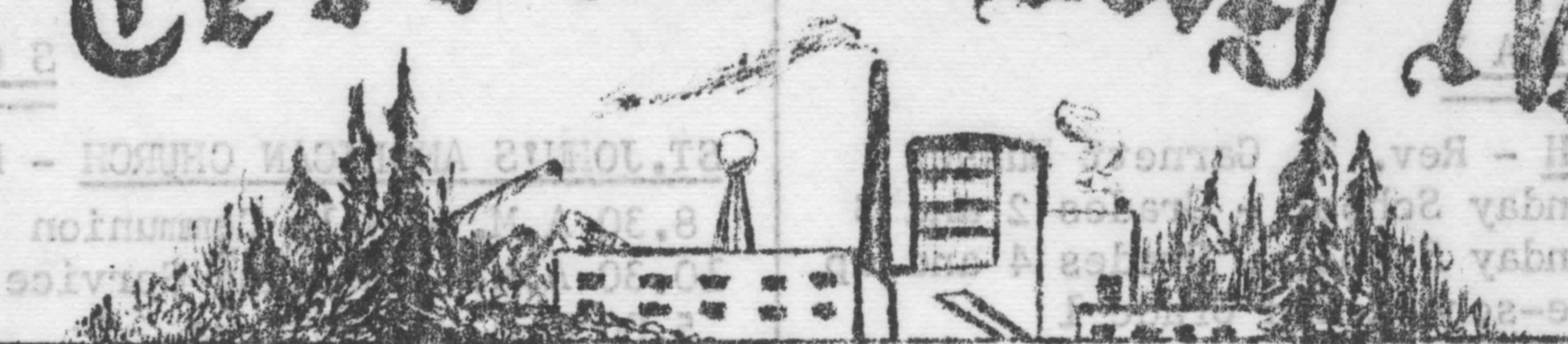

## CHAMBER OF COMMERCE REPORT

The Civic Improvement Committee of the Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce submitted a comprehensive report on findings and recommendations for improvements, consequent to their recent tour of the Townsite. The report was read and discussed at a meeting of the Chamber Council held in the Terrace Bay News office last Thursday evening. Copies of the report have been forwarded to Township Council and Kimberly-Clark Pulp and Paper Company.

In the same vein W. Colborne was appointed to study and report back on a long-range program on the Town's litter problem. The Chamber also propose a program to encourage citizens to support local industry and buy locally.

Douglas Fisher, M.P., has been contacted and promises to bring to the attention of the proper authorities, local efforts to have a low-power Radio Transmitter installed to service the Terrace Bay Area.

Authority was given to Chamber members who plan on attending the opening of the Saulte Bridge next weekend to be delegates of the Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce. Mr. J. Kelty offered to arrange to have a car banner prepared for use by delegates to various functions.

A letter from the Minister of Travel and Publicity announced the appointment of Terrace Bay Motor Hotel as an official Tourist Information Bureau.

J. Adamo reported on the proposed road sign and C.E. Paget (President) reported on signs for the Aguasabon Gorge. Mr. Kelty was authorized to make the necessary expenditures to have the Gorge trail put in order and some brushing done.

A letter was written to the Department of Highways drawing to their attention that the name of the River (Aguasabon) is mis-spelled on one of the road signs.

Following the announcement of President C.E. Paget that he would be leaving Terrace Bay soon, members unanimously carried a vote of heartfelt thanks to him for his very active participation in Chamber endeavours since the first committee was formed some two and one half years ago. The vote was proposed by J. Kelty and seconded by L. Waghorn.

The secretary was instructed to write a letter to Mill Manager J.A. Ferrier, conveying the Chamber's appreciation of entertainment provided to delegates attending the recent Area Conference.

Attending the meeting were C.E. Paget, J. Kelty, J. Adamo, J. Comisso, N. Cornthwaite, L. Waghorn, W. Colborne, R. Hirt and I.R. Marsh.

The next Council meeting was set for Thursday, June 6th in the Recreation Office at 8:00 P.M.
