Council approved the licensing of a new Taxi. The cost of lawn caretaking was passed for the shopping centre of the portion between the canopy and curbing only, plus triangle.

The Reeve reported on his telephone conversation with Bell Telephone Company officials concerning their property in the business sector, and further reported the Company's right to repossess such lands. The Council simply desired to have the land made available for future development, and not to enter into real estate.

Councillor Fraser enquired any small paving contracts for the town, with recommendations that the Hospital road intersection be widened. He was informed this was the property of the Department of Highways. Reeve Heenan announced he would bring in the findings of the Chamber of Commerce Spring Cleanup Campaign tour at the next meeting, to be then dealt with by Council.
