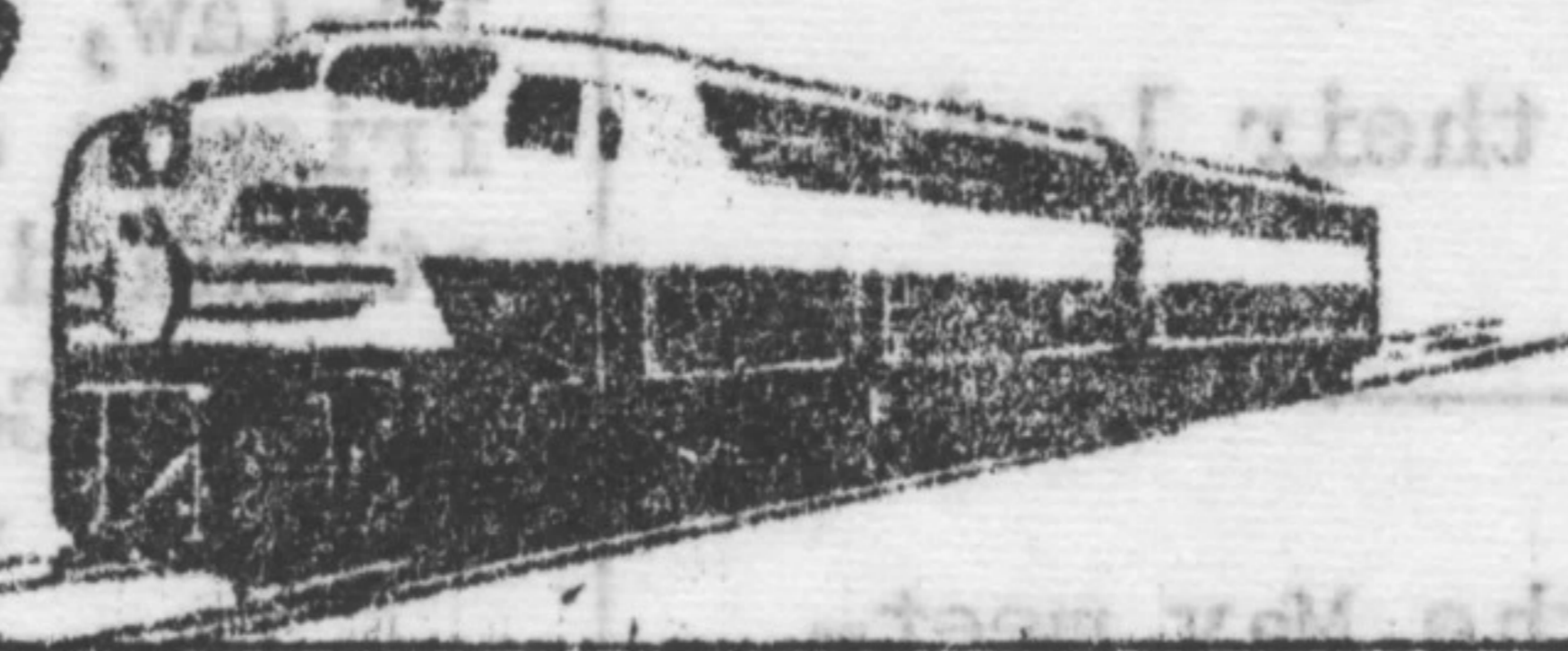

SALARY INCREASES GRANTED MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES

Councillor F.V. Harness presided in the absence of Reeve W.E. D'Arcy for the regular meeting of the Municipal Council on May 27th.

Council decided that, effective immediately rates for Cesspool pumping will be \$10.00 minimum for the first hour and \$7.00 for subsequent hours.

Two town employees requested a wage increase of twenty-five cents per hour. Council agreed that, effective June 1st, an increase of ten cents per hour be granted these employees and that E. Borutski, Road Supt., be given an increase of \$25.00 per month. Casual labor for the municipality will be paid at the rate of \$1.25 per hour.

Stanger Shows of Winnipeg requested permission to procure a license to play in Schreiber August 13 and 14. Clerk Skinner was instructed to write advising them that the license for the two days would be \$100.00 but Council will not be responsible or give permission to run any games contrary to the law.

The Dept. of Labour wrote stating recent changes in the Wage Act as they affect employees and employer.

The Schreiber Fastball League wrote requesting financial aid. This was not granted as it is not a practise of the Township.

The High School Board requested a cement side-walk on the South Side of Alberta Street from the Separate School up to and past the new High School. Since this expenditure was not considered in the 1963 budget this will not be constructed this year.

A letter was received from the C.P.R. regarding O.W.C.R. inspection report on the matter of fire pump piping. Councillor McGrath considered the consultant's report incorrect and Clerk Skinner was instructed to advise the C.P.R. of this.

Word was received that the Ontario Traffic Conference is holding its fourteenth annual conference at Port Arthur June 16-19.

Waterworks accounts in the amount of \$999.84 and General Accounts amounting to \$15,590.79 were ordered paid.

It was moved that, during the absence of Reeve W.E. D'Arcy, F.V. Harness be temporary signing officer for the Municipality of Schreiber.
