## SWIM LESSON NOTICE

During the first week of lessons, some problems have arisen from children attending lessons at the wrong times. It is very important that they attend only at the time stipulated, as groups have been divided according to ages, size and abilities.

Those who followed instructions by registering at the pool received slips of paper telling the names of the class, times and days of attendance. Those who did not follow instructions have been confused, and many of the children have been turning up at the wrong times.

**PLEASE CHECK THE TIME OF YOUR CHILD'S CLASSES WITH THE INSTRUCTOR AT THE POOL AT ANY TIME DURING THE DAY.**

With over 300 children taking lessons, it is extremely important that these rules be followed and that contact be made only with the instructor.

There has also been some controversy over the fact that some of the smaller swimmers must take lessons in the wading pool. This is necessary for two reasons: first of all, so that the instructor can see what the swimming ability of the individual is, and also because some of the swimmers are not yet tall enough for the large pool.

**GROUPS ARE DIVIDED SO THAT TALLER CHILDREN AND THOSE WITH SOME SWIMMING ABILITY WILL BE TAKING LESSONS IN THE LARGE POOL. AS SWIMMERS' ABILITY DEVELOPS, THEY WILL BE MOVED TO THE LARGER POOL.**

## COUNCIL QUOTES

Council met on Monday evening, July 8th in the Municipal Chamber presided over by Reeve, J.P. Heenan. A full attendance of Councillors included A. Valiquette, A. Fraser, W. Adamo and J. Wellings Secretary W.F. Strutt and Clerk W. Hanley.

Minutes of the previous meeting were accepted and correspondence listed. In reply Mr. Snell of the Department of Highways authorized installation of a light at the entrance to the Millroad on Highway 17, on a fifty-fifty cost.

A letter from the Reeve had shown to Mr. George McKinnon, Department of Lands and Forests, the Town's approval of the proposed venture by K. Dooley to build a garage and cabins within town limits. The Police Commissioner had requested details of pay and working conditions of the town's force for comparative purposes. Notice was given of the Thunder Bay Municipal League meeting in Port Arthur, July 11th.

Report for the month of June from the Fire Department listed no general callouts and only two service calls. Chief Hofland noted that in future the fire hose would not be loaned out without the direct permission of Council. He repeated his previous request for Department supplies and sought a solution to acquire his accumulated days off, due to relieving in the Police Department. Councillor Valiquette announced he would bring this matter up at the Police meeting Tuesday at 4:30.

Accounts for the month of June were discussed before passing for payment: Public Library - \$540.31, Hydro - \$19,704.02, Town - \$46,076.44, and Recreation - \$6,153.85. (Cont'd on Page 5)
