The newly-formed Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps Superior in Terrace Bay, sent off its first group of eight Cadets Saturday morning for summer training. The Cadets, Bill Duncan, Francis Helmink, Ken Wood, Clifford Wood, Bob Robinson, Don Pryor, Warren Pearen and Tom Gerow entrained for Toronto where they will transfer to TCA to fly to Sydney, Nova Scotia. Their training base for the next two weeks will be H.M.C.S. Acadia, the old Protector II at Point Edward Base. Selection of these Cadets was based on the results of a Naval Cadet examination, the top eight chosen. However, in the future, the Cadets will not be selected on this basis, with another group travelling each year.

The Cadets expect to participate in all local events and parades in the future and will be visited by the combined Cadet Corps and Band from R.C.S.C.C. Vindictive of Port Arthur and
