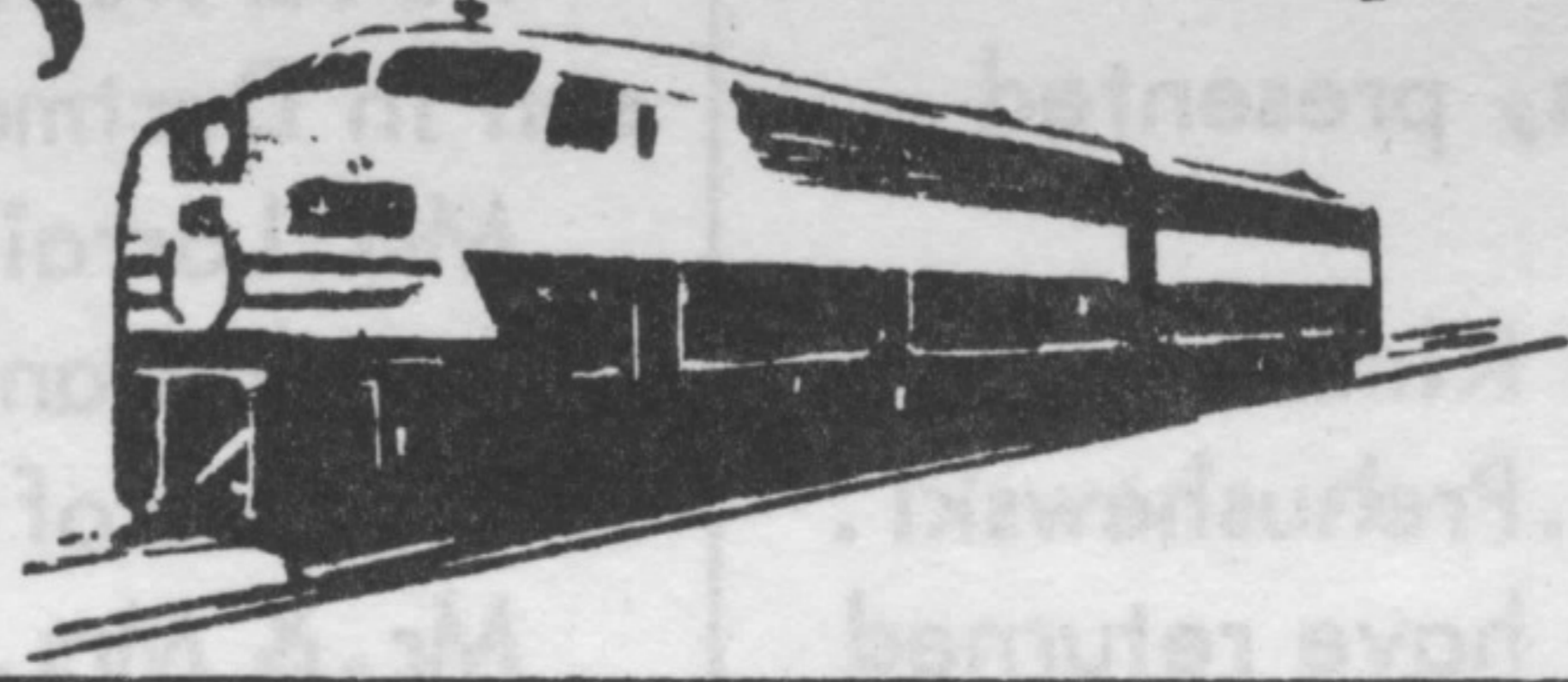

WELL-KNOWN RESIDENT DIES

Long time resident and former Township Clerk, W.A. Spicer passed away at his home on Monday, August 5th.

Born in England, Mr. Spicer came to Schreiber in 1912 and was employed by the C.P.R. for a time as Car Inspector. In 1954 he retired from the Municipal Office where he had served as Clerk-Treasurer for twenty-five years.

He was a member of the Church of England, the Orange Lodge, a charter member of Rebekah Lodge No. 279 and P.D.D.G.M. of the Oddfellows Lodge No. 402. He was predeceased by his wife in 1956.

Two daughters; Connie (Mrs. Hubert Weaver); Miss Irene (Queenie); one grandson, Bill Weaver, and three great grandchildren, all reside in Schreiber.

The funeral will be held in St. John's Anglican Church on Wednesday.
