Mrs. J. A. Quarry of Burlington, Ontario has been visiting her daughter, Betty Cavanaugh and family, for the last two weeks.

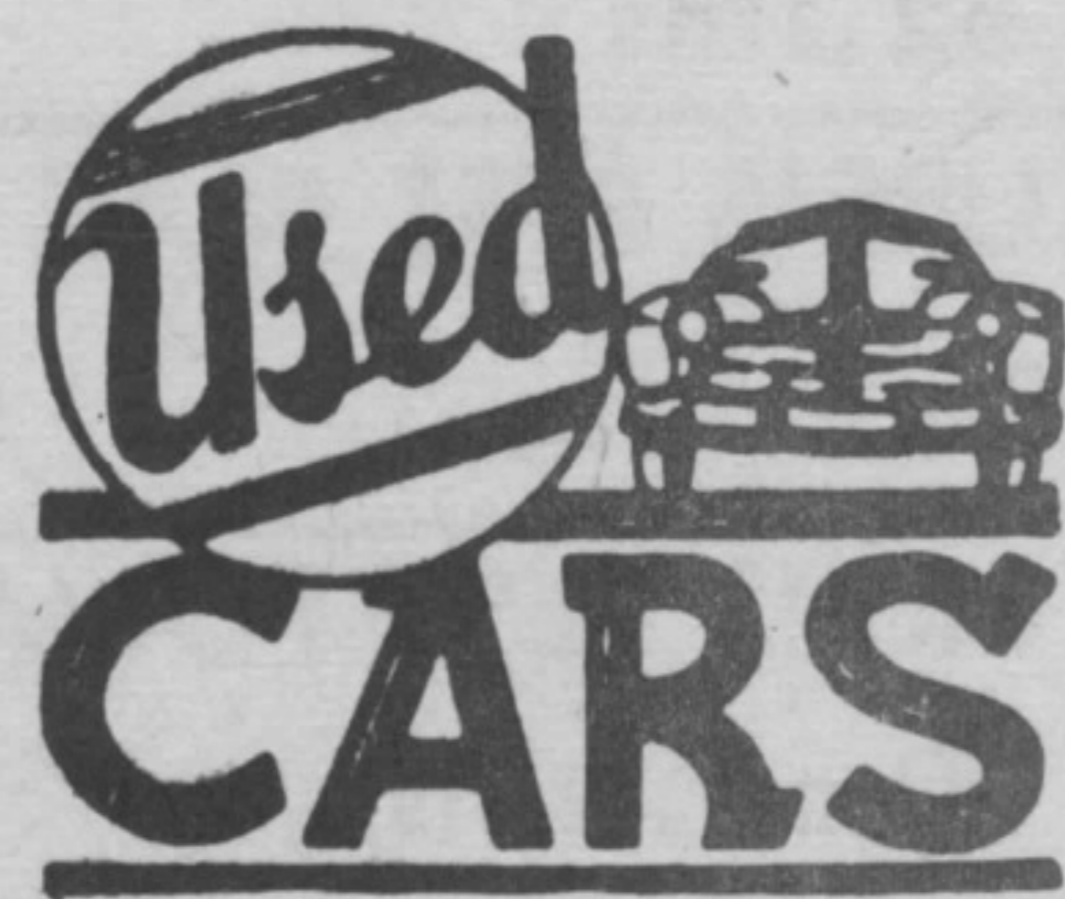
