HUNTERS TAKE NOTE

Hunters are well advised to take note of the following change in the Game and Fish Act as it applies to the possession of air-guns or firearms at night:-

Section 22 of the Act now reads as follows:-
"In a locality that game usually inhabits or in which game is usually found, no person shall have an air-gun or firearm in his possession for the purpose of hunting unless it is unloaded and encased between one half hour after sunset and one half hour before sunrise of any day."

The dismantled portion has been left out, in other words the firearms must be unloaded and encased.

BE SURE OF YOUR TARGET BEFORE YOU POINT THAT WEAPON.
