NAVY LEAGUE ELECT OFFICERS

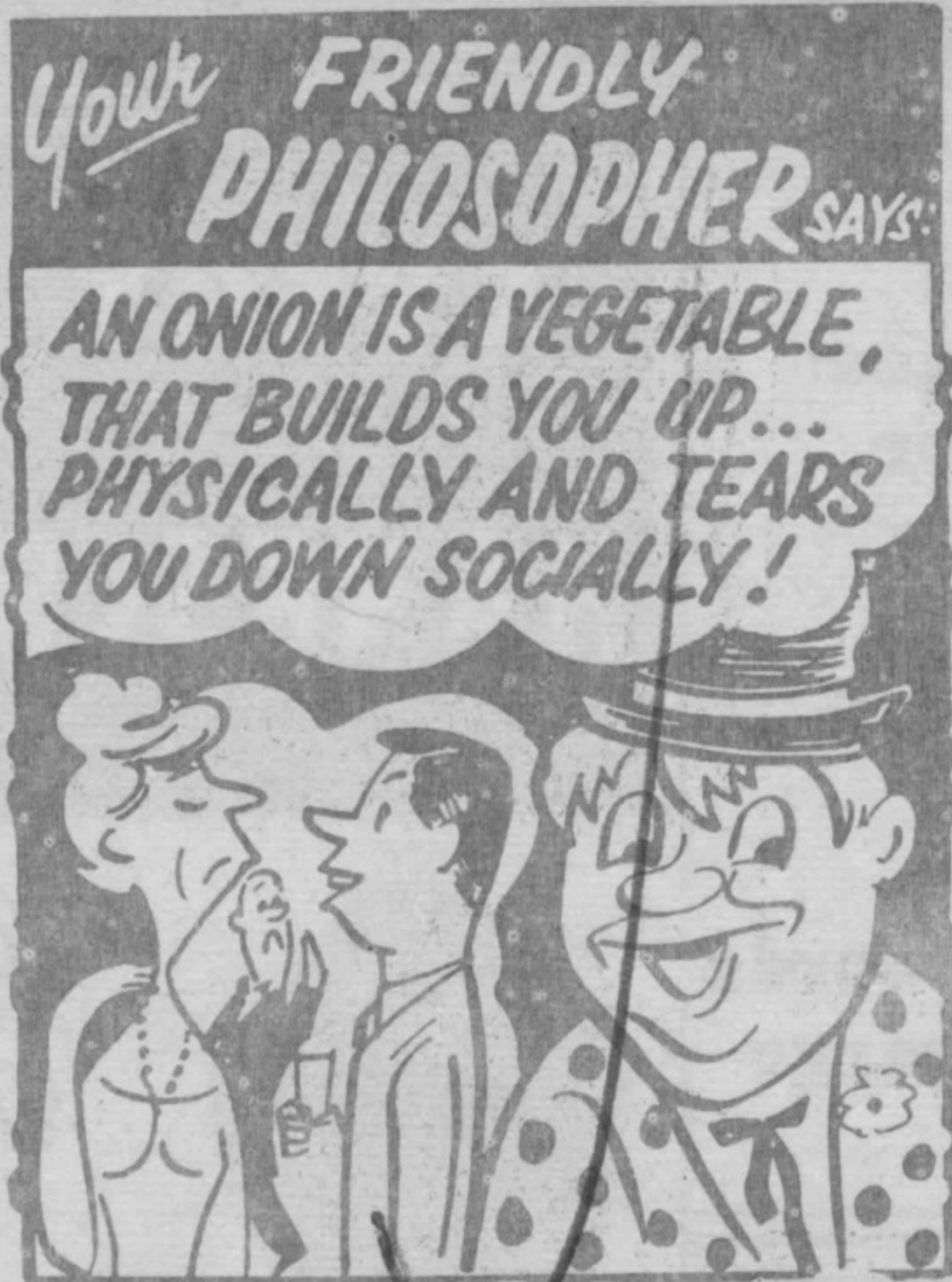
The Annual meeting of the Navy League was held on Thursday evening, October 3rd, in the Recreation Centre's meeting room, chaired by Arnold McKechnie.
