Also co-operating in the sponsoring of the course are the North Shore Minor Hockey Assoc., the Thunder Bay Hockey Association and the Community Programmes Branch of the Department of Education.

All aspects of the game will be covered, including basic skills of skating, shooting, passing; as well as sessions on training, handling of players, offensive play, defensive play and goal tending. In addition to, lectures on these subjects, films will be shown and ice demonstrations provided by members of the Terrace Bay Superiors and the Marathon Mercuries.

This course will apply particularly to Minor Hockey Coaches and is intended to give a sound knowledge of the basic skills required to teach young players.

A small course fee will be charged to cover costs of the hockey booklet and a Coaches' Manual which will be given to each delegate.

Instructors for the course will include E. Bolan, K. Ward, A. Leblanc and G. McMorland along with players from the Terrace Bay and Marathon senior teams, who will give ice demonstrations.
