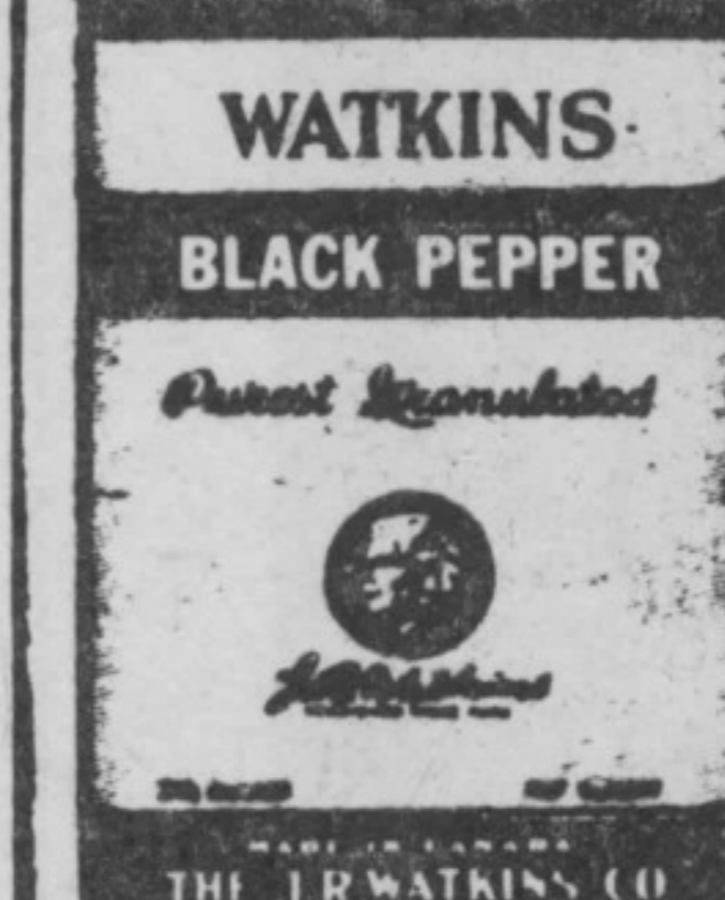
X-Word Puzzle
