The Rev. Reginald Inshaw, Rector of St. John's Anglican Church gave the address. He said that our response is a measure of our appreciation of the sacrifices made by our fallen heroes. Years ago an Athenian scholar said, in comforting mothers, that the names of their sons who fell in battle were not only engraved on stone but live on in the hearts and lives of men. Only as we show we owe our liberty, security and future by a response to public duties and patriotism, so we fulfill our part as trustees for life of the sacrifice earned by our fallen who gave their lives as a last full measure of devotion to us.
