The Board of Health met just prior to the regular meeting of Council Monday evening, when Dr. D.J.M. McCausland answered questions pertaining of health and sanitary inspections throughout the town. Restaurants, camp areas and garages with facilities receive regular inspections. Foodhandlers, barbers and hairdressers have been X-rayed. Dr. McCausland reported the schools in very good shape, with no serious outbreak of any communicable disease at present in town. In reply to questioning concerning the purchase of equipment for the schools to test hearing, he felt this to be worthy of their consideration.
