and Township accounts were passed for payment.

A letter was sent to Mr. Ferrier re the status of House 211 Kenogami Rd. Replies indicated that this house is reserved as a Police residence. Council are investigating the possibility of erecting a house for a Township employee.

The Fire Report was reviewed. This included a request to send two men to Fire School in the spring.

The High School Board recommended that A. Chisholm be reappointed for a one year term and W. Cavanaugh for two years. Councillor Cavanaugh strongly urged that the Board be brought up to five men. The Reeve explained how these appointments would have to be made. He also asked the Secretary Treasurer ascertain if all Boards are up to full capacity. The Recreation Committee recommended that the existing By-Law be up dated. The Reeve will consult the Dept. of Education re the Constitution of the Association before anything further is done.

The Library and Police budgets were submitted and the Fire budget will be brought in shortly.

A special meeting of Council will be held on January 21st at 4.45 P.M. to discuss town employee's salaries. The Reeve and Councillor Fraser explained in detail past negotiations on an ear testing machine. Council felt it advisable to investigate costs and details of a machine immediately.

Council reviewed a request from the Ski Club for an extended line and agreed to make a temporary installation costing \$250 this year and review the question again next year. They will also investi-

gate the Dog Catcher's request for a tranquilizer gun.

Councillor Cavanaugh proposed a By-Law whereby Councillors and Reeve would receive \$5 per meeting. Reeve Heenan, while agreeing that those serving are definitely out-of-pocket, requested that they bring in their considered opinions at the next meeting.

Councillor Cavanaugh was asked to arrange a meeting of the Police Committee and the two policemen in the near future. This will be held on Friday.
