Through the board of health, Dr. Cornell suggested the purchase of an audio meter for use on school children. Generally, it was felt that a local service club might be interested in adding this to their valued contributions to community welfare.

Mr. Jolicoeur was delegated to secure prices for spraying the town against fly and mosquito pests since, in particularly bad seasons, these are a very real hazard to young children.
