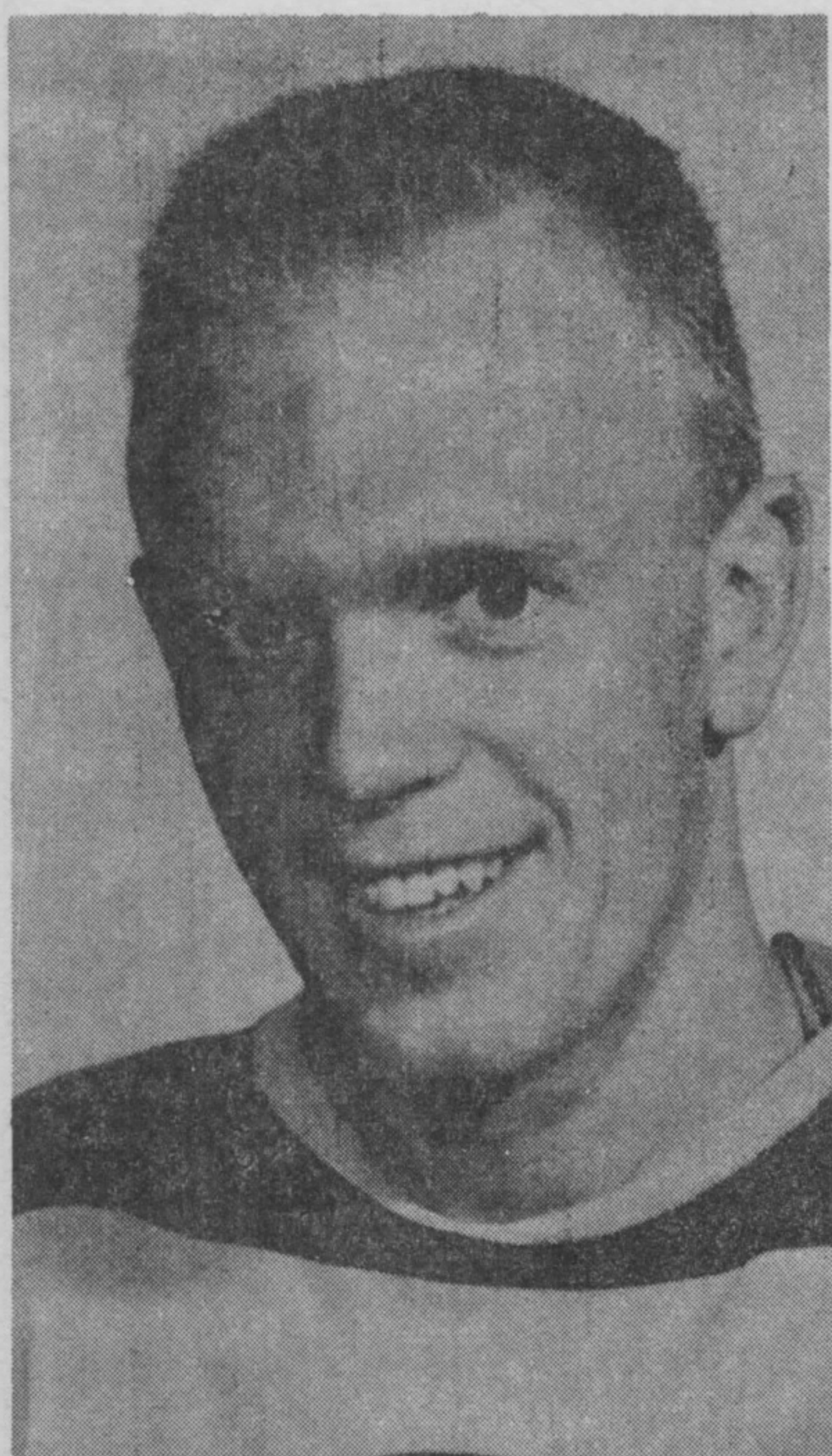
Next home game between Marathon and Terrace Bay is here on Thursday night. **DON'T MISS IT!!!**
