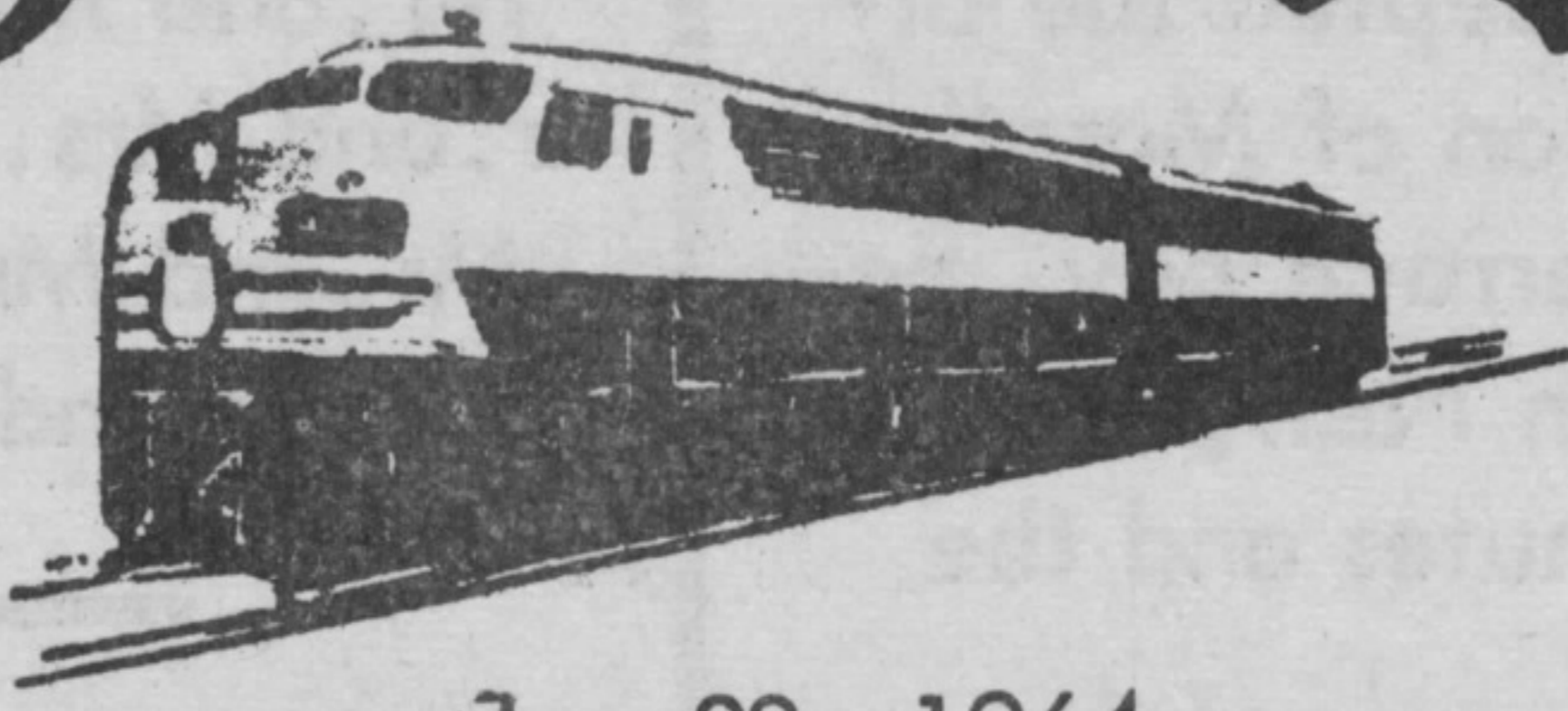

The Municipality of Schreiber last week welcomed Mr. Stanley W. Timmerman who commenced his duties on May 15 as Officer in Charge of Municipal Police.

Mr. Timmerman began his career with the Ontario Provincial Police at Hailebury in 1941, later joining the Kirkland Lake Police Force and, for the past eight years, was Chief Constable at Larder Lake. In 1946 he and a fellow officer were presented with the Royal Canadian Humane Society Award by Commissioner W.H. Stringer, O.B.E., of the Ontario Provincial Police for reviving a drowning victim by artificial respiration. This was the first time such an award had been made to a member of the O.P.P.

During his career Mr. Timmerman has been involved in the investigation of the usual number of cases of robbery, suicide, murder and traffic accidents but one of his most harrowing experiences was being attacked with an axe while investigating a disturbance. The man was later charged with attempted murder.

At the end of June Mr. Timmerman will be joined by his wife and four sons whose ages range from three months to 21 years of age. He also has a married daughter living in Virginia, Ontario.
