

**COUNCIL** (Continued from P.1) of plastic sheeting for the Swimming Pool's windbreak, noting there was a frost and heat warranty. Council therefore passed a motion to pay \$800. towards the cost, the remaining \$700 from Recreation.

Permission was granted the two constables to take one week vacation, after arranging necessary replacements. Police quarters would be moved to the basement of the Utilities Building until such time as permanent quarters were completed on the ground floor. They will move by June 15.

Enquiring about a Cemetery Board, Councillor Cavanaugh was informed this was no longer in existence. He recommended the approach to the Cemetery should be improved, but learned this was not Town property. Reeve Henan noted improvements at the Cemetery had cost \$1,000 last year.

Council learned no suggestions had been submitted to the Chamber of Commerce to date on their Centennial Project contest. If necessary, the Chamber would then submit their own recommendations. Council also had several suggested projects.

Councillor Fraser enquired about street cleaning and Councillor Brown reported the equipment was now in use and cleaning started.
