Mr. Gus Harris of Scarboro and Editor of the Credit Union News, was honored guest at a dinner in the Hotel during a visit here last week. Welcoming Mr. Harris, Don Brearley, an old acquaintance, quipped his introduction. Without hesitation, Mr. Harris had his audience chuckling as he replied.

On the serious side of his address, Mr. Harris noted how beneficial it was to have foreign investors with the courage to come into a country. Terrace Bay for example, had not even been here twenty years ago, and this country would probably not have been developed as it is, without such investors. As Editor for the Credit Union News, Mr. Harris was here to gather material for an issue showing the close harmony of Kimberly-Clark Corporation and the local Community Credit Union. This picture story was being compiled with the co-operation of Mr. Verl Thompson, local editor of the Kimberly-Clark publication, the Co-op.

Once thought a nickle and dime operation, the Credit Union has now over a half million members in Ontario alone. He described the recent start of the Credit Union in the Fiji Islands.
