AUTO ACCIDENTS INVESTIGATED BY LOCAL POLICE

Investigation on July 8th into an accident at the Mill road and Highway 17 revealed th at Daniel Hanlon of 59 Minot Street, Port Arthur, driver of a 1959 Ford Dump Truck had made an improper left turn, causing a vehicle owned and operated by Harry Stuck of Wisconsin, U.S.A., to collide with the **PROPER** rear end of the truck.

Mr. Stuck was treated at the Hospital STYLING for head injuries and released. Hanlon forfeited bail of \$12.50 on the improper turn charge. Dennis Bouchie of 3 Pine Crescent forfeited bail of \$72.50 on a careless driving charge and \$18.50 for operating a vehicle without a license on July 9th. The charges were laid by local police following investigation into an accident on Pine Crescent. Bouchie lost control of an auto and struck a fire hydrant near House 25.
