**LEGION HALL OPENED BY MINES MINISTER**

TERRACE BAY — "Out of all the misery and destruction of the past half century has come at least one glimmer or light which has brought hope, relief and friendship to the loved ones of so many of our deceased and disabled comrades — the Royal Canadian Legion", declared the Hon. George Wardrope, minister of mines and natural resources, Saturday evening at the dedication of the new Legion Hall in Terrace Bay. Indicating his pride in membership, Mr. Wardrope recalled his own service in the past two wars but emphasized to what great lengths they should go to prevent a repeat of these tragedies.

Certain that the breaking down of barriers between peoples would make war more and more remote, Mr. Wardrope referred to the welcome mat extended to all visitors from other countries, whether as tourists, students or businessmen. Quoting the United Nations Charter which guaranteed certain inalienable rights to all people, rights which we have enjoyed and are striving to uphold for all.

**MAGNIFICENT SHOW**

The dedication of another Legion Hall, this for Branch 223 in Terrace Bay, was an excellent example of local efforts by a comparatively small community," Mr. Wardrope stated. "These local efforts by small groups of people — much of which have been given in their spare time — add up on a national basis to a truly magnificent show."

Considering the building a memorial to those many thousands of Canadians, particularly from round about Terrace Bay, who made the supreme sacrifice so far away from home, immortalizing Canadians, Mr. Wardrope declared the Legion Hall, home of Branch 223, Royal Canadian Legion, officially opened.

Acting Chaplain Frank Ginn offered the dedication of the building and their colors to Almighty God, that they may never be desecrated by word or deed.

President of Branch 223, Comrade George Daniels welcomed and introduced the dignitaries attending the official opening: Mr. and Mrs. George Wardrope, Reeve and Mrs. J. P. Heenan, Alex Gray, Provincial of the Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario Command, and the Zone Commander Wally and Mrs. Lee of Marathon. As president also, he attributed the work to the many who had helped, particularly Willard Vezina, chairman of the building committee, the treasurer comrade, Les Sarka and the Ladies Auxiliary.
