COMMUNITY MOURNS PASSING OF HERMAN ROBERTS
Funeral services for the late Herman
Roberts, age 51, who passed away suddenly
October 21, were conducted Saturday afternoon at two from the Terrace Bay Community
Church. At the close of the hymn "Unto the
Hills Do I Lift Up Mine Eyes", Rev. T.
Garnett Husser described him as a pillar,
