Members of Council of the Terrace Bay Chamber of Commerce held their first meeting Thursday evening in the Recreation Centre with Reeve J.P. Heenan accepting the oath of office from President Neil Cornthwaite and Vice President Walter McMicking.

The President informed his Council members of Ken Weppler's acceptance to serve as Auditor with Bill Baillie. With only one standing committee established to date, Membership Chairman Joe Commisso was prepared with dues notices. A motion authorized the purchase of membership cards and materials. Mr. McMicking reminded Council members of the suggestions previously offered with regards to assessments and collection of dues, and the President tabled this item for a general meeting.
