ART CLUB NEWS

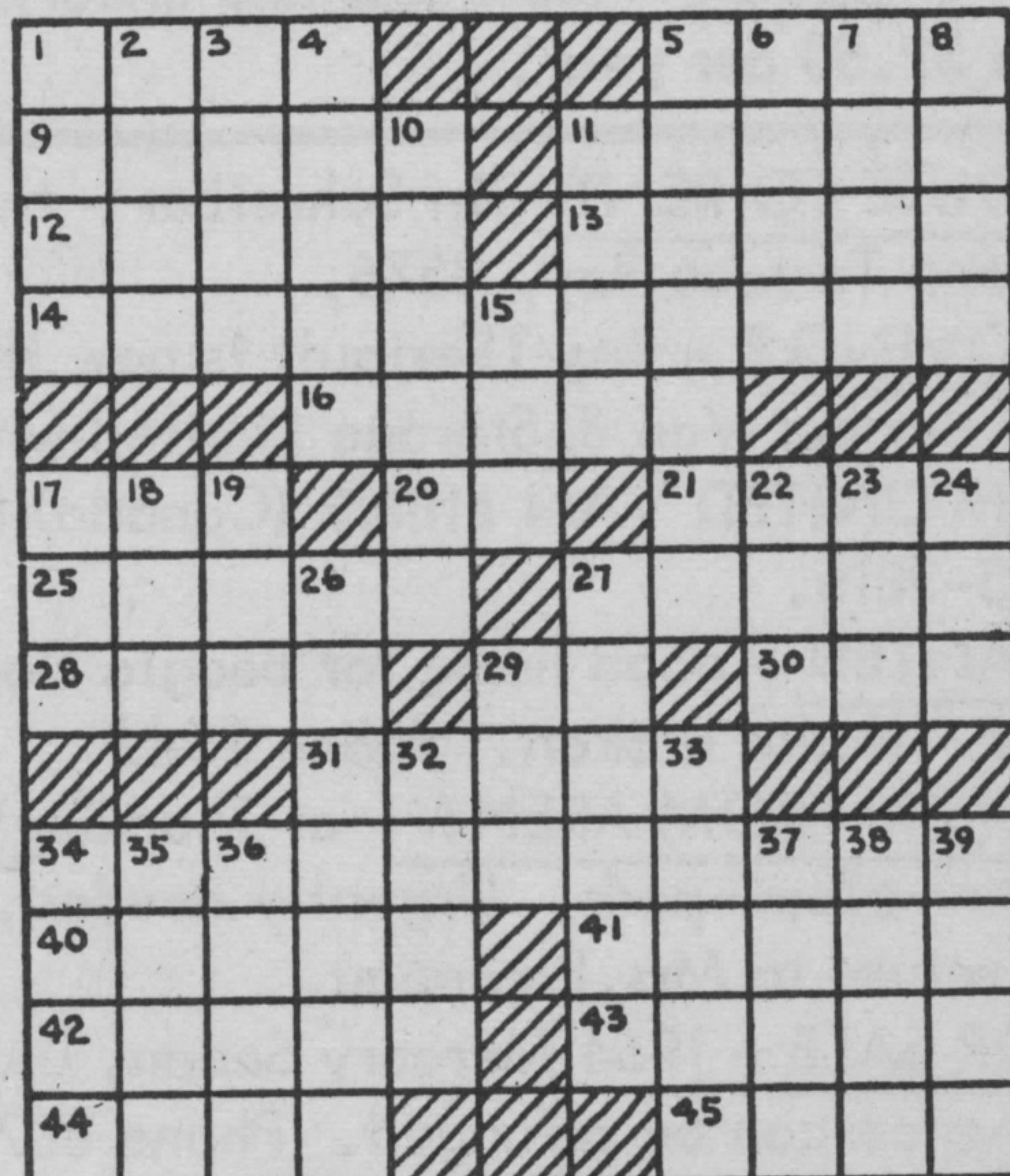
