COUNCIL QUOTES (Continued from page 1) the Recreation Committee, Council appointed B. Hayes and re-appointed Mrs. M.Hamilton, each for a three-year term on the Committee.

A letter was read in connection with establishing the Home for the Aged. Some Municipalities were against the present method of assessment and a brief was submitted to the Dept.of Municipal Affairs requesting a more equitable distribution of cost.

The working schedule of Mrs.E.Hodgkiss during the absence of a Recreation Director was received from the Recreation Committee and approved by Council. Mr. Beverley MacCauley of the Community Programs Branch met with the Recreation Committee on Thursday and members of Council were invited to sit in on this session. Grants and programming were to be discussed. The Police Department reported nothing of a serious nature over the month of December with not a single call or complaint over the holiday season. The two constables had remained on full duty during this period but were not bringing out a new schedule for 1965. Two fires were reported by the Fire Department for December, one in the Townsite Garage and Forestry Shed and an estimate on cost of new forest fire fighting equipment was being prepared. Blockages on the sewer lines which were being flushed was necessitating rewinterizing of hydrants each time. The Fire Chief requested to be informed when water pressure was to be down.

and 6 - Consideration to sidewalks in strategic areas. These were defined in some detail among Council members.

Councillor Cavanaugh detailed the discussions he and Councillor Brown had with the Constables wherein they had agreed to act as dogcatchers on off duty hours. Councillor Thompson interjected this should not be confined to off duty as the Police were concerned with the safety of children, in town and had been doing a more than adequate job of handling all complaints and problems. It was therefore agreed to continue the present arrangement. Continuing, Councillor Cavanaugh discussed with Council means of winter shelter at the pound. After describing a recent situtation concerning payment, Council agreed the Dog By-Law should be enforced as authorized, without exception. Councillor Thompson requested a special meeting for the review of wages and benefit plan for municipal employees. The meeting was schedules for Jan. 19 at 7 P.M., with the recommendation that someone other than Councillors, and authorized on the subject, peruse the benefit plan prior to the meeting. Relocating the Police Department was among the early requirements of Council, Councillor Thompson noted, commenting he was still of the opinion amalgamation was the answer for better service. 
