When you estimate the number of disabling injuries to be reported during 1965 it is recommended that you review the records of previous years for woodlands operations, mills and plants.

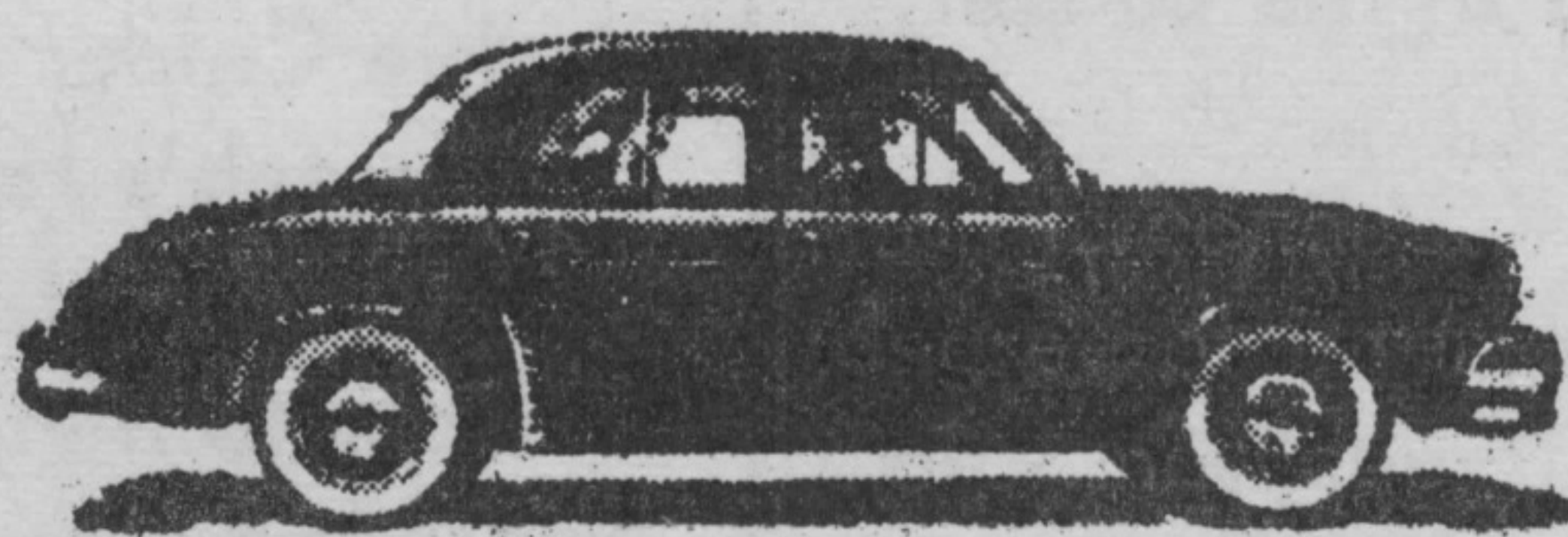
The rules provide that each entry must include a safety suggestion. Your idea can be related to home, traffic or industrial safety, or your own particular occupation.
