SMOKING SURVEY REVEALS CHANGING HABITS

During the past year The Canadian Cancer Society in conjunction with the Department of Education, conducted a survey to evaluate the effectiveness of the filmstrip, "To Smoke or Not to Smoke", which had been distributed throughout a great number of the secondary schools.

It was interesting to note that only 30% of the students had seen the filmstrip, indicating that a great deal has yet to be done if we are to place objectively before the younger generation the inherent dangers of excessive cigarette smoking and its relationship to lung cancer and other possible health hazards. It must, however, be stated that, although many students had not seen the filmstrip, some had possibly read articles, or had participated in class discussion on the topic of Smoking and Health.

Those students who did see the filmstrip felt that it explained the facts clearly and it indicated that smoking was a dangerous habit.

One of the most revealing points of this survey was the fact that 34% of those who had seen the filmstrip and had previously been smokers had now changed their smoking habits.

It has also been indicated that the need for education on the harmful aspects of excessive cigarette smoking should be aimed at a much lower age group. Therefore, future programmes will be developed for elementary as well as secondary school pupils.
