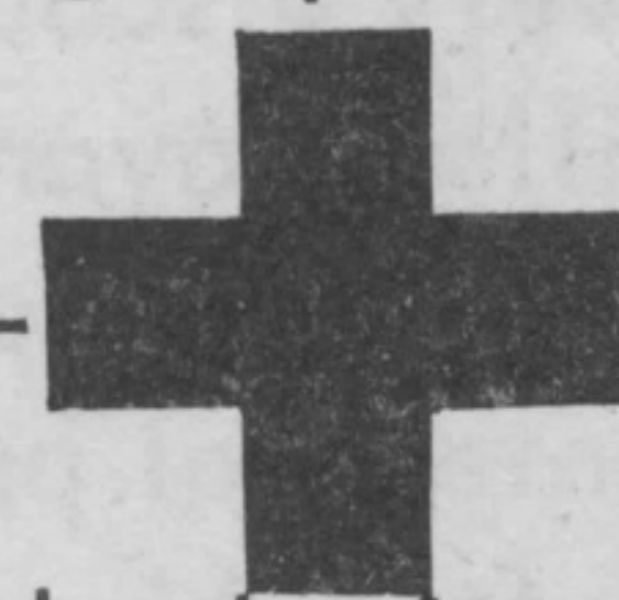

To celebrate their 50th anniversary the Terrace

 a dream of a mid-week church group for girls grew
 into reality when the National Girls Work Board
 started the Canadian Girls in Training.
