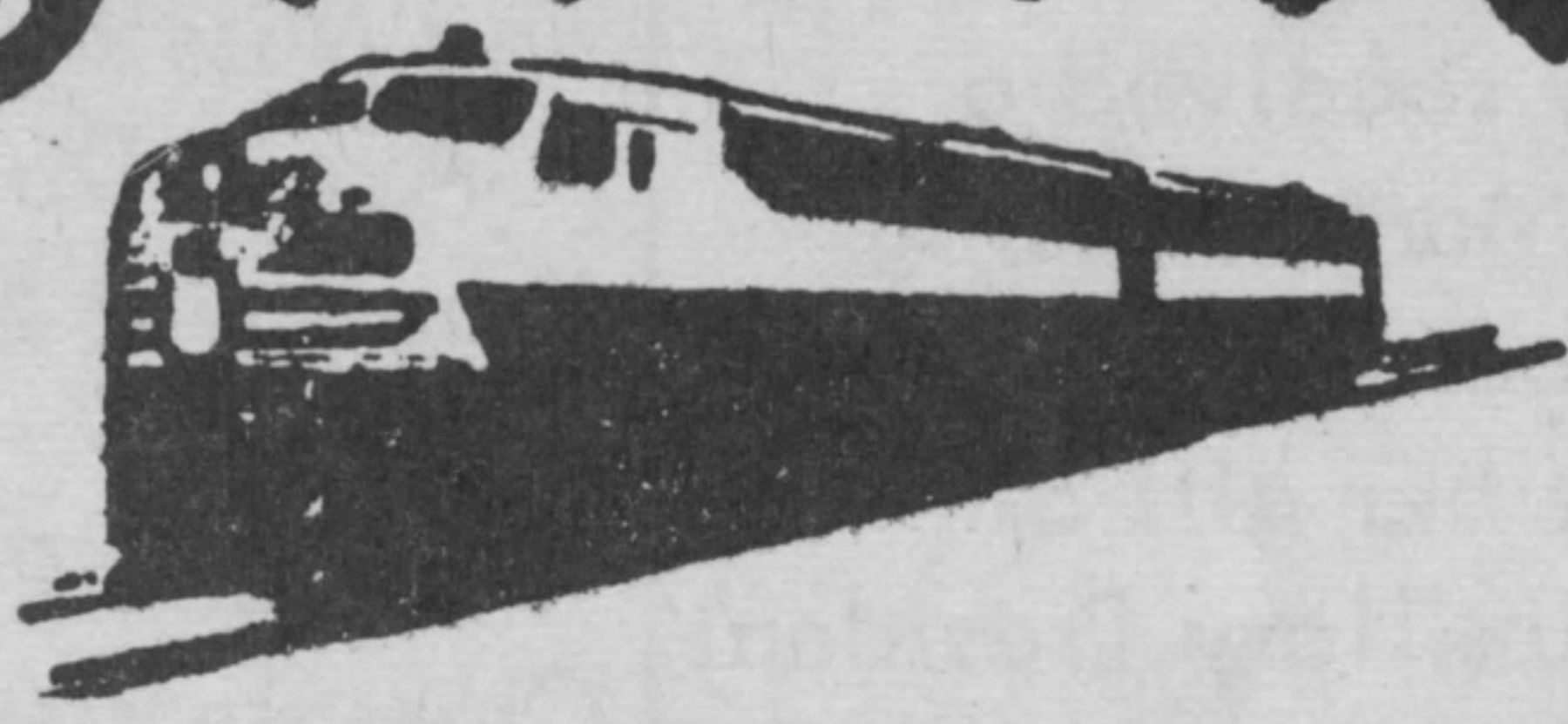

The cake for the happy occasion was made by Mrs. Jack McCouan.

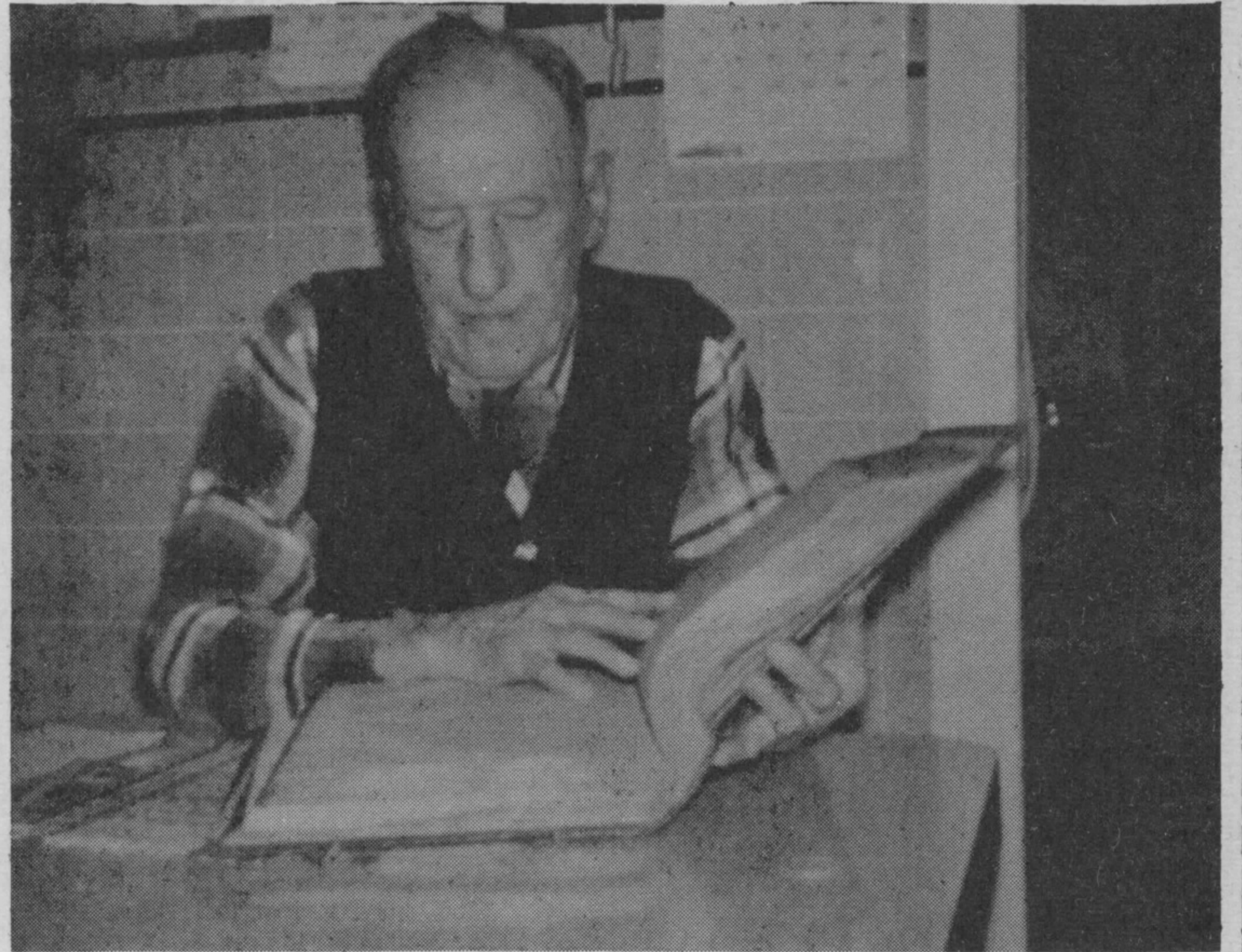
