Mrs. Frank MacDonald is in McKellar Hospital.

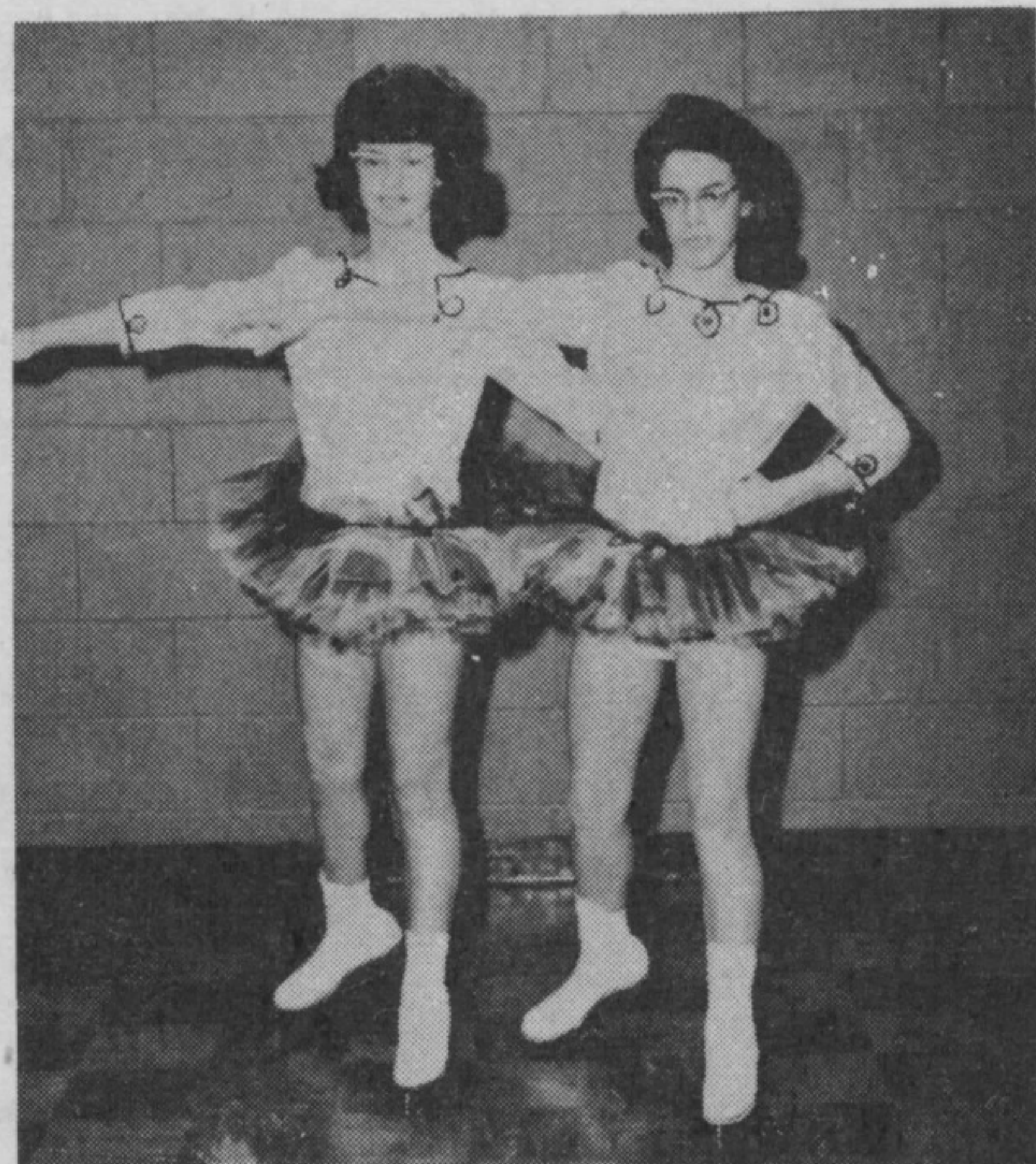
