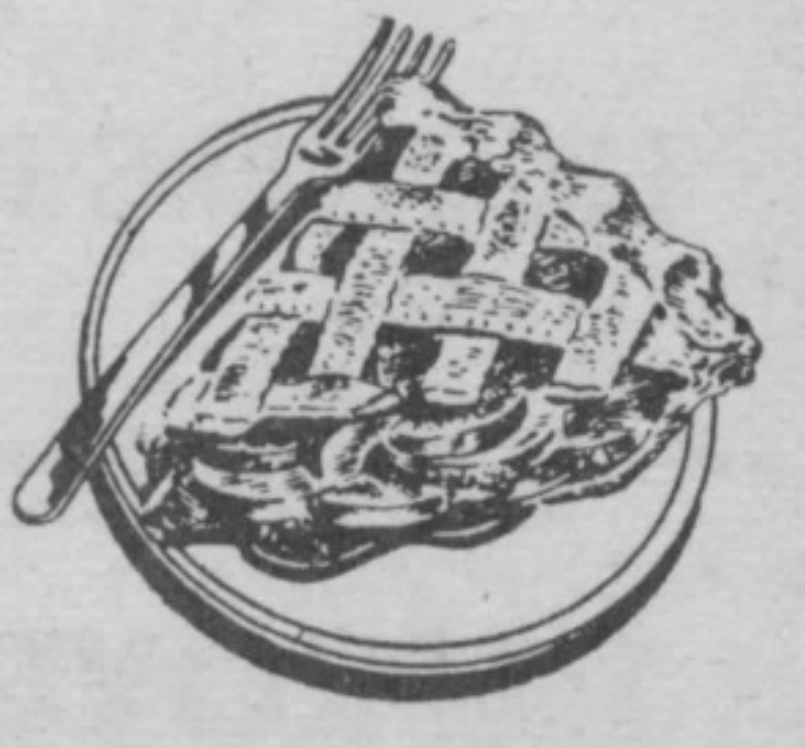

NOTICE

SCHREIBER TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS

Residents are asked to take notice that By-Laws Nos. 464 and 465 of the Township of Schreiber passed on the 8th day of June, 1965.

By-Law No. 464 sets out that at a fee of \$15.00 will be charged for every month or portion of a month the Trailer is located in the Township and fee must be payable in advance.

By-Law No. 465 sets out that the Township of Schreiber will prohibit the use and prohibit the owner or lessee of any Trailer from permitting the use of any Trailer for the living, sleeping or eating accommodation of persons within the Municipality with the exception of the Trailers now located in the Municipality.

Also the change of ownership or tenancy of any one of the Trailers now located in the Municipality will result in the Trailer having to be moved out of the Township.

A copy of the By-Laws may be seen at the Municipal Office during office hours.
