In explanation of the increase in 1965 Public School taxe rates, the following comparison is submitted.

The decrease in the Separate School Rate of 8.63 and 9.60 Mills is mostly the result of a surplus of \$9,489.08 carried over from 1964 to 1965.

The increase in the total Public School Mill Rate of 7.67 and 8.19 is mostly due to increased operating costs of education, .70 mills and .77 mills for the Public School requirements and 4.20 mills and 4.67 mills for High School requirements.

The slight increases in the general and town area rates is also due to increased operating costs.
