SAFETY FEATURES TO BE STANDARD EQUIFMENT Six additional safety features will become standard equipment on automobiles manufactured in Ontario during the 1966 model year. Windshield washers, left outside rear-view mirrors, padded dashboards, padded sun visors, rear seat belts and back-up lights will become standard quipment during the 1966 model year on automobiles manufactured in this Province. Individual manufacturers plan to provide further safety devices in addition to these items as either standard or optional equipment. Among these devices are multi-speed windshield wipers, improved windshield glass and safety door latches and hinghes. The 1966 models will be safest vehicles produced to date. Progress in vehicle safety has been substantial and it is anticipated that this progress will continue as rapidly as research makes it possible. It is hoped that the increased attention on vehicle safety will also help to make drivers more conscious of their personal responsibilities and to remind them
