checked out by members of the Department. Fire practice had been held on the alerting system and two volunteers were attending the Officers course September 13th to 17th at Gravenhurst. Cards are posted at the three schools and drills will be held. A statistical report from Corporal J. Doyle noted the Police Department had investigated twenty-nine occurrences, served two summons, issued thirty-five warnings, arrested two drunks, had five convictions. There had been five bicycles stolen and all recovered, no report of any breaking or entering and a steady check made. Councillor Thompson emphasized all monthly reports should be as concise and directed to the Chairman for presentation to Council.

Accounts were perused and questioned by Councillors Cavanaugh, Brown, Fraser and Thompson before being passed for payment; Public Library \$404.56, Hydro \$5,657.99, Township \$49,014.90, Snack Bar \$4,687.29, Recreation \$6,288.77. Reeve Adamo questioned the cut-back on Snack-Bar staff, hoping to have it financially caught up by the end of the year. He felt the changeover at the smoke shop should help and this would be ready when the bowling alleys are completed.

Councillor Brown stated that, following a town tour with representatives of the Mill last spring, the Company had sent out letters to all tenants of company homes where clean up had been required. He recommended a letter be drafted for private homes, and sent out by Council as needed. Reeve Adamo requested a letter be sent immediately to a resident harbouring an old truck. (Continued on Page 8)
