just as soon travel a little further to the Lakehead
 and be able to take the patient for an outing in one
 of their parks.

There were near twenty representatives at the
 Municipal League meeting; all very capable indivi-
 duals and willing to help you with your problems.
 If they had been told of the other point of view they
 would have been helped in making their decisions.
 Only seven had attended the meeting in Nipigon
 last spring. With Nipigon's Reeve pressing his
 political advantage in this political year and Gerald-
 ton's Reeve exerting the same pressure, it had come
 to the ridiculous situation of three District Homes.
 Councillor Thompson felt many of the Municipalities
 outside these centres having heard arguments on the
 subject would now like time to back up and re-
 evaluate the situation. He requested the Town's
 Secretary to get legal advice on: (1) Do we have to
 support three Homes or one? (2) Can we ask for a
 new vote of Municipalities based on the new finan-
 cial figures?

Councillor Thompson also reported briefly the
 discussion concerning a District Assessor, which
 also should be looked at very thoroughly before a
 commitment was made.

The appointment of Mrs. Forbes Cruickshank
 proposed by the Separate School Board, to replace

Mr. Ken MacLeod (Hydro) for the balance of the
 year on the High School Board was passed by Council.
 The High School Board sought a meeting with Council
 to make a formal presentation of their plans for an
 addition to the High School. These plans had now
 received the approval of the Department of Education.
 Council agreed to meet with the Board Friday evening

The Ontario Hydro Commission are initiating their
 dryer promotion throughout the Province and re-
 quested the support. Council approved the local
 Hydro funds be used to co-sponsor the advertising
 with Schreiber.

The Township was requested to outline their method
 of financing the capitol project by the Centennial
 Committee and to specify when it would be budgeted.

Council was informed the installation of pinsetting
 equipment has been deferred for the present time
 until suitable arrangements can be made.

Councillor Brown asked that the Department of
 Transport be contacted requesting the services of an
 examiner.

High School and Public School property still regis-
 tered under the Improvement District were to have a
 transfer of ownership through the Town's solicitor.

The School Nurse, Mrs. Lois Hopper, met with
 the Council prior to their meeting to discuss her
 hours of work and complete her report. She will
 arrange to be at the Public and Separate Schools
 one day a week and a half day at the High School.
 The High School program will be instituted as soon
 as their Guidance room is finished. This program is
 comparable to those in the district as set up under
 the auspices of the Public Health Department.
