

LADIES CURLING CLUB NEWS

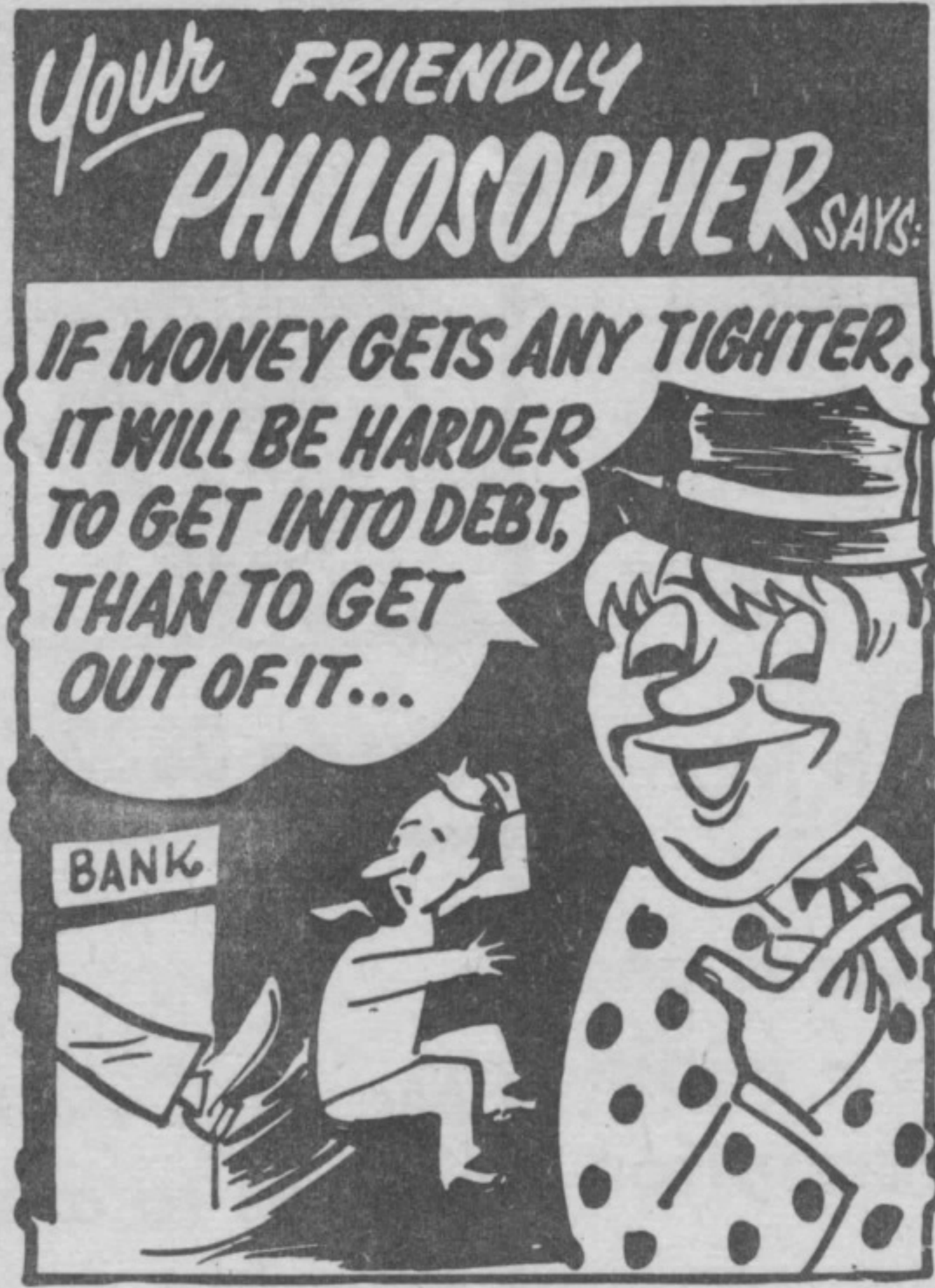
The ladies Curling season is well away with a group of enthusiastic curlers. Many new curlers are out with twelve rinks playing in the evening and four in the afternoon league.
