OTTAWA, April 8 - Stocks of potatoes are below last year's and prices are expected to continue to climb. Butter has gone up two cents following implementation of a new dairy policy but beef and pork prices may drop a little.

Onions continue to be a good buy. Supplies are heavy and prices low. The price of eggs will remain firm, easing slightly in May. Supplies of broilers are adequate and prices will remain fairly steady through May. Turkeys will remain at the current level of prices and the market on cheddar cheese will remain stable.
